Mock Eviction Trial, Brian Chase, Atlas Law

Attorneys and staff will be performing a mock eviction trial based on a resident's violation of the community's rules and regulations. The mock trial will simulate what happens in a rules-based eviction lawsuit. The moderators will stop the mock trial at various points to offer suggestions on how problems can be avoided by better preparation before the trial. The presentation will also include a review of the most common types of rule cases that a community owner might experience: (1) clutter/unkempt homes; (2) unapproved occupants; and (3) behavioral issues. The presenters will attempt to provide relevant information in a real-world format to allow community owners to see what goes on at a rules-based eviction. Attendees will learn why better preparation almost always yields better results.
